Digital Festival of Archaeology 11 – 19 July 2020 Call for Yorkshire images

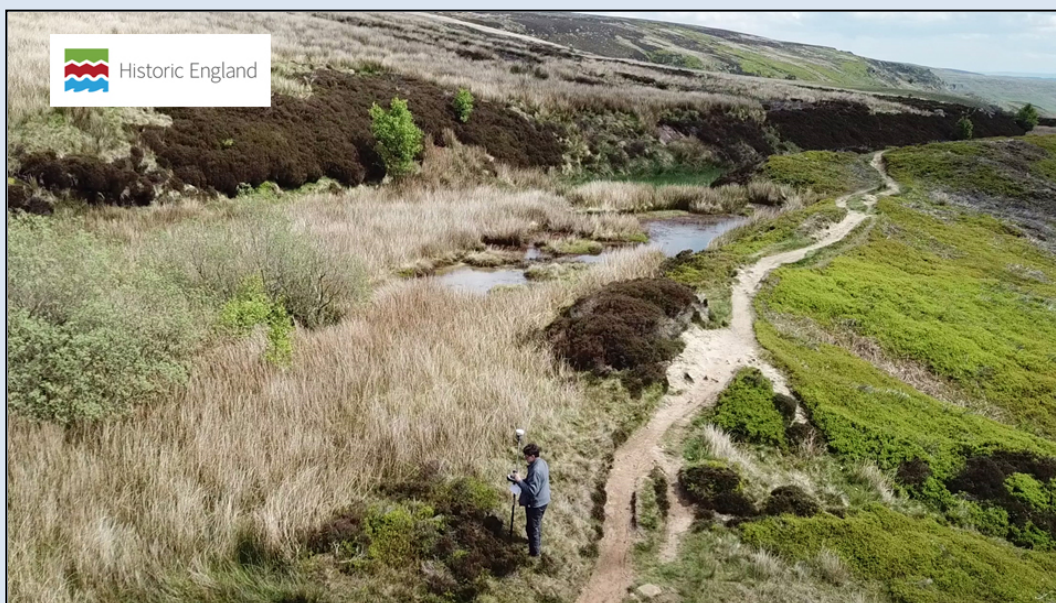

We welcome an image (or possibly two) from every member or affiliated group, demonstrating your archaeological discoveries, each with a short caption of around 150 words, and a logo if you have one. Hopefully this is not too difficult a request as you probably have an excess of photographs and only need to let us know what they show and where they were taken.

We can deal with most formats of photographs, but a .jpeg is preferable, either with the caption/logo embedded or as separate files for us to combine later.
